Remediation Update

Countywide has nearly 20 years of data indicating our liner system that protects groundwater is working as designed

The team of experienced landfill personnel at Countywide continue to follow an Operations, Monitoring, and Maintenance Plan in partnership with the Ohio and US EPA. Overall, data measuring the amount of leachate, hydrogen, and settlement associated with the reaction continue to trend downward. While we do not know when the reaction will conclude, landfill personnel will continue to closely monitor all activities associated with it. Additionally, all monitoring continues to show that area groundwater and air show no exceedances of regulatory or health -based levels of concern for target pollutants
